Surveyed works designated "Great American Novels" with attention to their reception history and questions of literary value

  American attitudes towards consumerism, work, social mobility, and
  technological change.
- "Genre Fiction," advanced lecture-discussion course

  Surveys and theorizes genre fiction in American literature, specifically focusing on the Western and the hard-boiled detective novel.
