Description	Rhetoric is the word ancient Greeks used 2300 years ago (or thereabouts) to describe various forms of public, spoken, persuasive language. Since then, rhetoric has come to describe many different forms of communication undertaken for many different purposes: spoken and written language, still and moving images, sounds of various kinds, and more. It's a wide and deep concept. It's also an area of inquiry: there are people who study it. Or, rather, they study some aspect of it.				
	This course introduces you to conceptual issues involved in the study of <i>rhetoric</i> . Specifically, it introduce you to some questions scholars in recent decades have asked about how best to study <i>rhetoric</i> . These are questions of theory and method.
